Read John 13

- 9. Think of these words from the perspective of the journey that the disciples are about to go on. A journey that Jesus knows. Re-read 14:1-6. How does that change the way you read/understand 14:1-6?
- 10. How willing are you to let Jesus plan the whole itinerary of your life? Explain.
- 11. What part of LifeWay's journey so far has been the most exciting/scary/adventurous in your opinion?
- 12. If you were in charge of choosing the next step of LifeWay's (or your own Church's) adventure, in which direction would you like to see the community go?

Read Acts 1:1-8

When Jesus went on a journey back to his heavenly Father at the Ascension, he spoke these words to those left on earth to continue his mission to the world. His disciples were already filled with the Holy Spirit. They already believed that Jesus was the Christ, the Son of the Living God. But to continue his mission and reach the final destination, they need the power of the Holy Spirit for the ministry to which they have been called - making disciples of all nations, baptising and teaching, and being his living witnesses to the ends of the earth. The strength they need and the power required for this task doesn't not come from within, but from without, as a gift from a loving God who has planned the itinerary for his people.

- 13. What confidence does this give you for your journey ahead? How might it change your willingness to step out on this next adventure of faith?
- 14. What do these verses tell us about the scope of the adventure we are to embark on?
- 15. In what ways could we as a Church reach out in ever expanding ways that have an ever growing influence in the world?

One of the great metaphors that the BIble employs is that of a journey. From Genesis to Revelation, the Bible is full of people on the move as journey after journey is recorded and remembered. Abraham goes on a journey from Ur of the Chaldees to to the Promised Land. Many generations later, the people of Israel journey from slavery and oppression in Egypt into the land promised to them. Along the way the choices they made led them on journeys into captivity before going back again to the Promise Land. In the NT, Jesus journeyed from heaven to earth to 'pitch his tent among us.' He is constantly on the move, journeying through Palestine as he preached the Good News of the Kingdom of God, showing people what the Kingdom looks like by his deeds of love and power. After the Resurrection, Paul and the apostles journey all over the Roman Empire, and their message reaches to the ends of the earth – their story and journey now connecting with ours. Journeying is a part of who we are as humans. We make sense of our lives by understanding them as journeys, as the unfolding story of who we are and what we do in the world.

- 16. Think of your own journey. Choose 5 events or encounters or moments that have shaped your journey and led you to this point and share with the group.
- 17. What have you learnt about God and yourself through these events.
- * Praise God for his willigness to be with us on our journey. Thank Jesus for planning the itinerary for our mission adventure and leading us on the way. Ask the Holy Spirit to fill you daily with the power you need to step out and go where he calls you.
- * Pray with thanks to God for the journey you have been on so far and for his guidance and presence in that journey.
- * for our Church that as we prepare to launch Vision2030: Beyond Limits that God will lead, direct and protect us on the journey and that we would be a people who are living, sharing and growing in his way and having an ever expanding witness in the world.
- * for LifeWay Music and the first EP about to be launched, that God would use those songs to meet people where they are at in their journey and lead them deeper in his way that their lives may be transformed by his grace.
