Worship series: ANCIENT CREED: LIVING FAITH I believe in God who is Here Now (#5 in series)





The LORD will keep you from all harm – he will watch over your life; the Lord will watch over your coming and going both now and for evermore.

Psalm 121:7,8



God for us. God with us. God in us. You will never be alone in this world ever. That's Jesus promise. Adrift, abandoned, untethered. Excluded. On the fringe. Not heard. Alone. Left to find your own way. Do any of those words resonate with your spirit today? It's the sign of an orphan spirit. "I have noone". "I wish I could just talk to mum right now" "What I would do to have Dad's wisdom for this decision." "I still have my parents, but why do I feel I'm on my own?" There are seasons in life when changes, tragedies, or circumstances leave us asking orphan questions. There are moments when the struggles of simply living in this life are so overwhelming and we feel so alone. But that is not the truth or the reality of life in Jesus. When we confess, "I believe in the Holy Spirit", we are speaking the promise of God into being, that we have a God who is here now...with us...for us...always. We'll experience how the Holy Spirit protects and keeps us in the presence of Christ every day as we explore "I believe in God who is here now.'



Read John 14:15-21

- 5. What do you hear this scripture saying to you right now?
- 6. What do Jesus' words say about him?
- 7. Discuss verses 19 & 20
 - a. Explain verse 19 in plain, concrete terms to one another.
 - b. When we hear the word 'commands' we often think of law and how the law condemns us in our sin. Since we have now been liberated from bondage to sin, how could you explain 'commands' here, in light of the Gospel? Do you expect joy and fulfilment from these commands?



Read Psalm 121 again

God, 'watching over us' or 'guarding us' is a picture of the guards on the eastern wall of Jerusalem watching the trade route from east to west as it approaches the city. It is along this road that traders bring wealth and prosperity to Israel, but it is also the road that invasion forces most often approached the walled city to make war.

- 9. How do these two images fit with your understanding of God our Father, Jesus our Saviour, and the Holy Spirit our comforter, travelling companion and coach?
