- 1. Share your highs and lows since you last met with one another.
- 2. Share how you went with your living purposefully from last time?
- 3. In sport, are you more at home playing offence or defence? Why?
- 4. Have you ever had any enemies? How did you know they were enemies and are they still enemies?
- 5. When you hear in our vision statement advancing the Kingdom locally and globally what image does it draw to your mind and how are you advancing the Kingdom in your life?

It's heard in changerooms, on courts and grounds of all major sports - "The best defence is a good offense." If you score more points, tries and goals than your opposition, then you will win. Jesus takes that saying to a whole new level when it comes to advancing the cause of the Gospel. For Jesus it isn't about winning or losing, but about mercy, grace and living in imitation of the Father who gives life and joy and shows compassion even to those who don't deserve it. In a world that is all too ready to win at any cost, Jesus shows a way forward that gives life, breathes hope, multiplies joy and advances his kingdom locally and globally in a way that is radically countercultural.



Read Luke 6:27-36



- 6. When you hear this passage which part speaks to you, challenges you, seem most diffcult for you, make no sense?
- 7. How is this part of Jesus' sermon consistent with what he has just said in 6:24-26? How do you think the disciples reacted? How do you react? Why?
- 8. How are these words from Jesus an offensive strategy rather than a defensive one
- 9. In what ways is doing good to those who do good to us, loving those who love us, essentially self-centered?

This whole section in Luke 6, is not addressed to the general public, but specifically to the disciples. Jesus is not giving us a list of things that we have to do and tick off, but rather describing an attitude that he wants to see present in his children - who he wants us to be. The impact of the Gospel, when it is lived out amongst those who are not deserving of it and those who treat us badly, is a simple witness to the power of God's love, which alone can transform lives. At times that is tough, but as Jesus reminds us, we too are recipients of a mercy that we did not deserve. That alone cn prompt and spur us on to showing mercy that is not self-serving; a mercy he show when he spread his arms wide upon the cross to offer God's loving embrace to each and all of us.

- 10. What is God's desire even for our enemies?
- 11. In light of what we know God desires for all people (1 Timothy 2:4) what does it mean in Romans 12:20, when it says "you will heap burning coals on his head"?
- 12. How do you react and respond when someone does something nice for you that you don't deserve?
- 13. Someone once said that when we eat a meal together, we turn enemies into friends. How have you experienced that in your own life?
- 14. As a result of this study, what is one concrete step you can take to be more aware of situations in which you can be merciful each day?
